A Look Back At Our Early Days ...

2002 - On Thursday, September 12, an initial Board of Directors took charge of the newly formed "Greater Summerville Music Forum".

The Statement of Purpose was agreed to and is: *To promote the performance interests of local music lovers. To provide links for individuals and groups to meet for informal practice and performance. To provide musical experience for the public, and generally to encourage the making of music in our community.*

The words Greater Summerville in the name by no means excludes those who live out of town. In fact, it is hoped and expected that people from all geographic areas will become involved as members, actively participate and be listed in the directory the group plans to publish soon. The directory is a central focus of the Music Forum and will allow musicians and vocalists to contact each other for informal practice or performance, find accompanists, form ensembles, chamber or choral groups, jam sessions and perhaps become involved in coaching or mentoring relationships. We want to think that the possibilities are endless. It is also the hope of the organizers that Greater Summerville will eventually build a reputation as a place where music experiences are treasured, numerous and an integral part of community life.

It is also agreed that the organization will remain non-profit and that membership dues, which include a listing in the directory, will be \$10. per person per year.

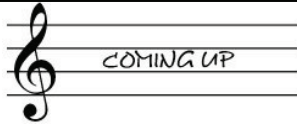
What's next for the forum?

His discography includes *The Water is Wide* (2005) with flutist Tacy Edwards, *Hauntings* (2004) with Moravian Philharmonic Orchestra and his solo CD *Guitar America* (1999).
